Mission to South Africa

In 1964 Stuart and Marilyn, with their young daughters, went to South Africa as Missionaries. The Herders joined them in 1968. Although the Lord led the Herders to other ministries, Stuart and Marilyn stayed in South Africa and faithfully worked until God called them home. shared the message of Jesus with the people there. Stuart was tragically killed in a car accident in 2010 and Marilyn passed away in 2021.

Their daughter, Connie Wicks had been working with them for some time and she became director of the mission. First Christian Church has supported the work ever since Marilyn came and spoke to us in 2012. (many still call it 'the Marilyn Cook Ministry') Individuals put their change and bills in the special offering container and it is sent to the mission.

Connie describes the work they do in South Africa.

Spreading the Word: sharing Jesus with the children by teaching them gospel songs, giving Bible stories and praying with them.

Feeding programs: disadvantaged children, youth, the unemployed and the aged in some of the poorest parts of the nation.

Rural aid projects: Supply of bulk food, clothing and basic essentials to the poor in remote tribal villages in the far north borders of South Africa.

Spiritual instruction, motivation, administrative work, planning, strategizing and fund raising for many black welfare organizations who are mostly child or youth based and have no other means of support.

Mission to South Africa is funded by caring individuals and churches in the USA and South Africa.

Connie was here 2 years ago and will be here with us on Sunday, July 28, showing pictures and talking about the work Come out and be blessed as you hear of one way Christ's work is being done in South Africa.
